RESOLUTION No. 2013-04 Roadway Lighting

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Transportation has programmed Project NH 0212(156)306, PCN 023T for ADA & Resurfacing of US Highway 212 through Redfield.

WHEREAS, the South Dakota Department of Transportation by Policy and Procedure for Roadway Lighting of State Highways, makes available use of Federal Aide funding for construction of new roadway lighting.

AND WHEREAS, the Policy and Procedure for Roadway Lighting requires that the City of Redfield pay the local match (about 20%) for use of Federal Aide and agree to operate and maintain the system once installed.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF REDFIELD that the City of Redfield agrees to pay matching funds for the use of Federal Aide and agrees to operate and maintain the Roadway Lighting System through the City of Redfield on US Highway 212 once installed.
